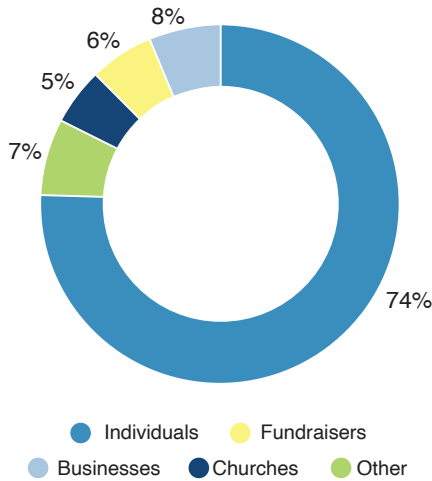

We pro-actively analyze our performance and strive to improve in a never-ending quest to continually raise our programs to a new level of excellence.

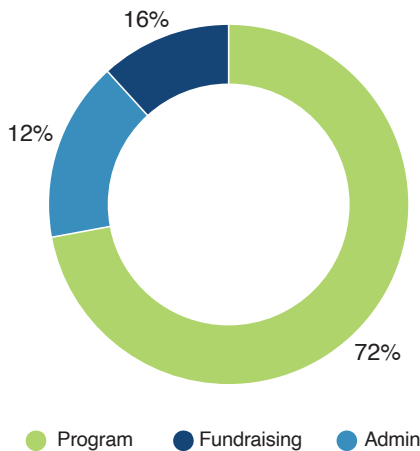
Honesty & Integrity

CAMPUS HIGHLIGHTS
